Pointing out that at the Parliamentary Election held in 2010, people had elected those who did not even have a basic knowledge about the Constitution and the basic laws of the land, the People's Action for Free and Fair Elections (PAFFREL) urged the public to elect a team of intelligent representatives.

Executive Director of the PAFFREL, Rohana Hettiarachchi told the Media yesterday representatives who are elected should perform the role of Parliamentarians knowledgeable to legislate, formulate policies and responsibly manage public finance.

In particular, the PAFFREL called on all political parties to stop election propaganda activities during the silent period using various dubious tactics, and under the guise of performing religious and sports events.
